About the Fellowship Program

The Division of Infectious Diseases Fellowship training program in infectious diseases is organized to provide training and supervised experience at a sufficient level for the ID fellow to acquire the competency of a specialist in the field of infectious diseases. The ID training program is a minimum of 2 years in duration. All RRC and ABIM requirements are met in the first two years of training. During their training, the ID fellows participate in a formal didactic experience, a wide variety of direct patient care rotations and learning experiences designed to teach all six core competencies as specified by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) which is the accrediting body for all residency and fellowship training programs nationwide.
