KEYNOTE SPEAKER



Christopher Senkowski, M.D. is Professor and Chair, Department of Surgery, Program Director for General Surgery Residency, Mercer University School of Medicine, Savannah Campus. Originally from Michigan, Dr. Senkowski went to medical school in Boston attending Harvard

Medical School. He completed his residency at Mount Sinai Medical Center. Following this, he went to Miami where he completed both fellowships in trauma surgery and surgical critical care at Jackson Memorial Hospital. Dr. Senkowski subsequently moved to Memorial Health University Medical Center in Savannah, Georgia where he became an attending for general surgery and surgical oncology. He quickly rose through the ranks where he eventually attained his current position as Professor and Chair. Dr. Senkowski sits on a number of national service committees. He is an editorial board reviewer for the Journal of the American College of Surgeons and Journal of Trauma. In addition, he is a member of several professional societies including the Society of Surgical Chairs, American Association for the Surgery of Trauma, American College of Surgeons Oncology Group and many others. He will speak to us on the topic of: “**Aligning Quality with Education: More “Hoops” or Better Patient Care**”.

Objectives: Review background and development of CLER initiative; describe best curricular options for residents: lean six sigma, IHI, or NSQUIP QITI; discuss implications on quality in the value based purchasing world.
