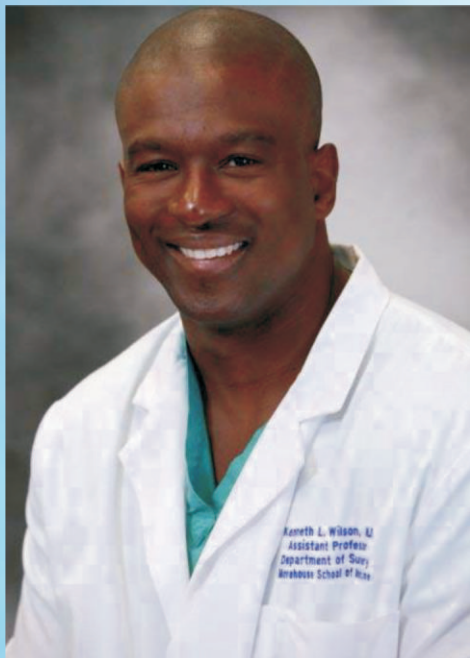


CELEBRATING: *African American History Month*
