

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#### 16th ANNUAL HISTORY OF MEDICINE SYMPOSIUM

#### **Keynote Speaker:**

David R. Welling, M.D., FACS, FASCRS, DMCC



Dr. Welling received his first military training and military obligation while an undergraduate student (in Chemistry) at Brigham Young University, Provo, Utah; he graduated from BYU with honors in 1969. While at BYU, he interrupted his studies for 2 ½ years to serve a mission for his Church in France. He was commissioned an officer in the US Air Force through the AFROTC program at BYU and was given an educational delay from active duty to go to medical school at the University of Utah in Salt Lake City, Utah. He came on active-duty as a senior in medical school in 1972 and was to spend the next 30 years on active duty, retiring from the Air Force in June of 2002 as a full Colonel (06).

Some of the highlights of his military career included spending 9 years in total in Germany, 9 years at Travis AFB in California (where he served as Chief of Surgery for the last 8 years of that stay), and 3 years at Landstuhl Regional Medical Center where he was Chief of General Surgery. He was sponsored by the Air Force to do a colorectal surgery fellowship training program in 1986-87 at Mayo Clinic, Rochester MN. Dr. Welling was board-certified in General Surgery in December 1979 and has subsequently re-

certified in General Surgery in 1989, 1999, and 2009. He was also board-certified in colorectal surgery in 1988.

After military retirement and after spending six months working in locum tenens positions in Arizona and Utah, Dr. Welling joined the faculty of the Uniformed Services University in December 2002 as an Associate Professor of Surgery. In August of 2012, he was given an academic promotion to Professor of Surgery. While at the Uniformed Services University, he has served as Chairman, International Relations Committee of the Norman M. Rich Department of Surgery and has worked hard to promote international exchanges and understanding especially in behalf of the medical students at USU. He has also been a principle adviser to the Surgery Interest Group, a very active organization of dues-paying first and second-year students interested in surgery. He has served on a number of committees and is a member of a number of prestigious organizations. He is a credentialed provider at Walter Reed National Military Medical Center. He has been married to Lindy for over 47 years; they have three children and ten grandchildren. He is fluent in French, speaks conversational German, and is learning Spanish.
